LOUISIANA BOARD OF REGENTS
MINIMUM ADMISSION STANDARDS for FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN

The Board of Regents establishes minimum admission standards for regular freshman admission at a Louisiana public university – flagship, statewide, or regional.* **Universities may adopt additional, more specific or rigorous requirements for admission: students should check with the specific institution for additional information.**

(1) <i>High School Curriculum</i>	<p>Regents' Core: 19 units (from Core 4 Curriculum)</p> <p>Those courses in the English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language, and Arts Categories as defined in the Core 4 Curriculum listed in Louisiana Department of Education Bulletins 741</p> <p><i>(Louisiana Handbook for School Administrators; and Louisiana Handbook for Nonpublic School Administrators)</i></p>
	<u>AND</u>
(2) <i>HS GPA</i>	Minimum overall HS GPA — 2.0
	<u>AND</u>
(3) <i>Developmental Courses</i>	<p>Developmental courses needed, per BoR AA Policy 2.18: 0 at Flagship and Statewide universities; ≤1 at Regional universities</p> <p>[Example: ACT English score ≥ 18; ACT Math score ≥ 19; and other measures in AA 2.18]</p>
	<u>AND ONE of the FOLLOWING</u>
(4) <i>HS Core GPA</i>	<p>GPA on the <i>Core</i> — 3.0 – Flagship GPA on the <i>Core</i> — 2.5 – Statewide GPA on the <i>Core</i> — 2.0 – Regional</p>
-or-	<u>OR</u>
<i>ACT</i>	<p>ACT Composite — 25 – Flagship ACT Composite — 23 – Statewide ACT Composite — 20 – Regional</p>

* **Flagship:** LSU. **Statewide:** LA Tech, ULL, UNO. **Regional:** Grambling, LSU-A, LSU-S, McNeese, Nicholls, NSU, SLU, SU, SUNO, ULM.

Two-Year institutions are open admission for freshmen students; contact the institution for information.

Typical 12th Grade Schedule-TOPS University Diploma

ENGLISH:

- English IV: on-level or Honors

MATH:

Must have earned credit in Algebra II:

- Pre-Cal (H)/(DE) (DE must have qualifying PLAN/ACT score and pay fee for course)
Or
- Algebra III (replaces Functions & Stats.)

SCIENCE:

- Biology II on-level or (H) or
- Physics on-level or (H) or
- Chemistry II AP

SOCIAL STUDIES:

- World History: on-level or AP

Foreign Language (If student hasn't already completed it):

- Spanish II or French II

Electives:

- At least (1) elective. *Students must have at least 5 classes for their senior year. Students may also choose to do an internship which counts as 2 credits

Typical 12th Grade Schedule-TOPS Tech JumpStart Diploma

ENGLISH: (4 units required)

- English IV or
- Business English

MATH: (4 units required)

- Math Essentials and/or
- Financial Literacy (formerly Financial Math)

SCIENCE:(2 units required)

- May not need a science class if full credit was earned in Physical Science and Biology

SOCIAL STUDIES:(2 units required)

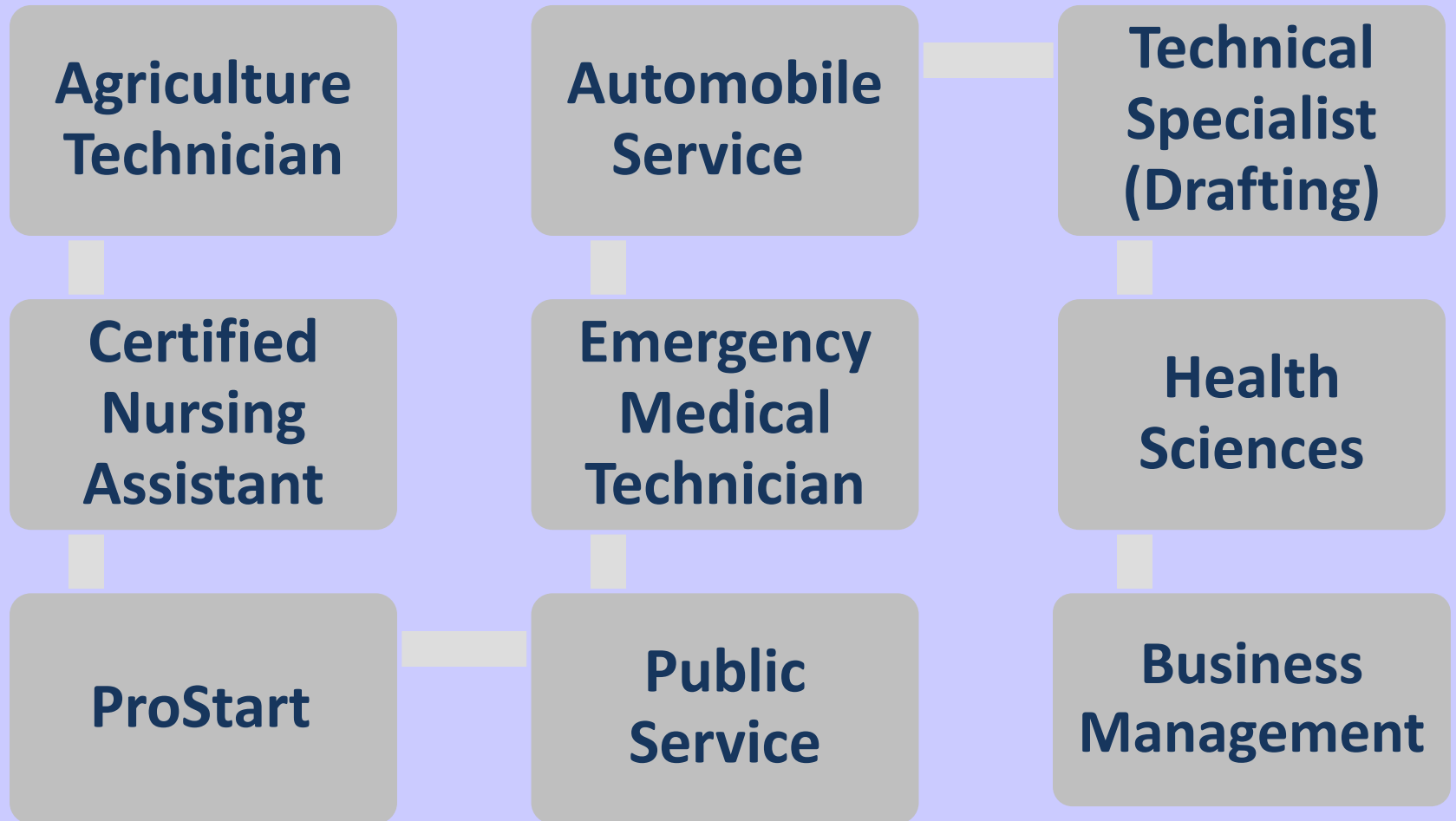
- U.S. History Government (required)
- Government (formerly Civics)

Electives:

- Elective choices must be chosen from pathway

Advanced Level Courses

- **Advanced Placement (AP)** – AP courses are rigorous, college-level courses designed to prepare high school students to sit for the AP exam (in that subject area) with hopes of achieving a passing score. This score then transfers to college as credit earned. All students enrolled in AP classes must take the AP exam.
- **Dual Enrollment (DE):** Through local partnerships with SLU & Northshore Technical College, students are able to earn college credit as well as high school credit at a significantly reduced cost. Grades earned in DE courses are included in the calculation of your cumulative college GPA and will affect your TOPS continuation eligibility. Student must have a qualifying ACT score to enroll in DE course.
- Students enrolled in AP or DE must pay appropriate fees and take required exams.

New Courses

- Financial Literacy (replaces Financial Math)
- Chemistry II AP
- Algebra III (replaces Functions & Statistics)
- Architectural Drafting
- Law Studies

Schedule Submission/Other Info...

- Parents should review their students' schedules, **and sign the back of the scheduling card under Permission to Schedule.**
- If a student is requesting to be scheduled into honors, AP, or DE classes, the parent and student must also sign the back of the schedule card under Advanced Level courses.
- Students must turn in their schedule cards to student services by **Friday, February 3, 2017.**
- Students must have **17** credits to be classified as a senior **by the first day of the 2017-18 school year.**
